Main goals

The FoFauPopU project is a response to conservation and development issues around the Kibale National Park. The project involves (component 1) strengthening the collective governance of local communities in Sebitoli and the institutions involved and (component 2) reducing human-wildlife conflicts and nuisances in the northern part of the Park and improving human and animal health

Specific objectives

As for component 3, it focuses on the development and economic valorization of activities encouraging collaborative conservation. For this, the tea sector was identified as responding to a **quality and profitable niche market**. It is therefore a question of ensuring a transition from a full sun monoculture tea system to a diversified **agroforestry** system of **organic** tea also ensuring the role of refuge for **biodiversity** and **carbon** storage
