Executive Board



Denis LOYER - Chairman

Trained in agronomist and fisheries, Denis Loyer worked for 28 years at the French Development Agency (AFD) in Africa, Madagascar and the Caribbean and he then created the environment and natural resources department of AFD in 2002.
