Small producers are vulnerable to price fluctuations due to price volatility and limited access to information. Through information services, their revenues can increase! The N'Kalô service provides information to all the producers of a sector, ensuring fair trade throughout the chain. It is thus not limited to niche markets.

N'KALÔ: a service integrating trainings, information access and advice adapted to all the actors of the chain

25000 producers and 25 cooperatives in 3 countries, 2 value chains : revenues increase by a minimum 25%

Limits to the concept that "the polluter must pay", collapse of the carbon market, difficulty of access to mandatory and voluntary requirements: is it possible to act constructively at a global scale?

JUMELAGE CARBONE is a tool that is accessible to all and that allows the public to be involved in simple, cheap environmental gestures. Savings thereby realized can therefore finance access to clean energy in disadvantaged areas.

Design and implementation of the Jumelage Carbone service with an initial fundraising effort that raised 5000€ from 100 subscribers

OUR **ACTIONS** IN

2012 SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

The agrifood industry must respond to growing economic, energy, environmental and social issues. In a globalised economy, pressure on natural resources increases and poorer populations' adaptive capacity has diminished. In 2012, in order to better address these global challenges, RONGEAD led a series of actions to reinforce the capacity of local actors and to facilitate exchanges between stakeholders.

Examples: In Tanzania, RONGEAD organized the first multi-actor roundtable, regrouping all the stakeholders of the « Nile Perch » value chain - from the fishermen to the distributors - in order to exchange views and to raise awareness of different social and environmental issues. The objective is to improve the operation of the supply chain and to allow fishing communities to sustainably live from their livelihoods on the basis of concrete commitments by all actors and economic operators.



In Gabon, Moabi oil is extracted from the almonds of an endemic tree by communities that safequard the traditional knowledge required to complete this process. Natural resources are a potential source of revenue, but their use must be strictly controlled in order to avoid over-exploitation, bio-piracy or environmental degradation. Gabon is the first country to have ratified the Nagoya Protocol, an international treaty on access to genetic resources and the fair and equitable sharing of benefits arising from their use. Today, RONGEAD acts with local actors to define the conditions and modalities for the implementation of sustainable and fair value chains

Global agricultural commodity markets are facing growing price volatility, compounded by various issues: the globalisation of markets, reforms in agricultural and food chains, climate change and emerging new markets. Small producers, more specifically their revenues and investment capacity, are most affected by this volatility. Regardless of which regulation policies are implemented by governments, it is up to the actors of the international agrifood chains to integrate new management techniques, through a holistic approach combining an understanding of market factors with rational decision making.

Examples: In order for small farmers, local and professional actors as well as public institutions to better understand and act within the global agricultural sector, RONGEAD developed an information and advice service for the cashew nut, sesame seed. Shea butter and corn value chains. These comprehensive services are currently offered in the Ivory Coast, Mali, Burkina Faso and Senegal.

In Burkina and the Ivory Coast, income diversification of family farms requires increasingly hi-tech and innovative agrarian systems in order to respond to growing local demand. Commercial gardening and beekeeping can be relevant and viable production options once adapted to local markets.

Agriculture plays a major role within the new international climate and energy frameworks. Thus, RONGEAD developed technological innovations that merge agricultural and energy production. This innovation incorporates economic, environmental and social dimensions to improve access to sustainable energy within production chains.

Examples: In Burkina, a clean and economic solution for reuse of cashew nut shells, the main waste of nut shelling, has been designed, tested and implemented. This technology has been developed as a tool for small-scale cashew nut shelling industries. As such, three services are provided to cashew nut processors consisting of: dealing with 20% of daily shell wastes without burn-off emissions, replacing 100% of daily fuel wood, and producing shell charcoal that can be a substitute for wood charcoal.

In the Ivory Coast and Tanzania, RONGEAD supports the implementation and promotion of biogaz (the methanisation of organic waste) campaigns through the diffusion of economically viable models, adapted to a variety of contexts.
